Gertler:

- 1. What is the *identity thesis* form of physicalism?
- 2. What do dualists deny?

- 4. Explain the disembodiment argument for dualism.
- 5. Explain the physicalist objection (found in section 5) to the disembodiment argument.

Papineau:

- 1. With what particular philosophical puzzle is Papineau's "The Case for Materialism" concerned? What solution to the puzzle does Papineau embrace?
- 2. Explain Papineau's causal argument for materialism.
- 3. Explain epiphenomenalism and pre-established harmony. Explain how they serve as objections to premise 1 of Papineau's causal argument.
- 4. According to Papineau, how might one go about denying premise 3? Explain.
- 5. According to Papineau, how might one go about denying premise 2? Explain.
